IN VIRGINIA, state graded feeder cattle mostly 1.00 to 16.00 lower. Feeder cattle at regular auction sales mostly 9.00 to 19.00 lower. Slaughter cows mostly 1.00 to 4.00 lower. Wheat new crop mostly .04 higher. Corn mostly .25 higher, new crop .06 higher. Soybeans mostly .17 higher, new crop .12 lower.
